Attendance:

 All D-E parents/guardians and/or caregivers must download the School Pass app and use School Pass to indicate their child(ren)'s attendance updates and

- On days when a student does not have a first-period class or obligation, they are expected to sign in with the attendance office upon arrival at school. Failure to do so will result in detention moving forward. Please remind your student of this policy and encourage them to sign in when applicable.

Academic Progress:

- If a student knows they will miss a quiz or test due to a planned absence (e.g., sports game, appointment), it is their responsibility to coordinate with their teacher in advance to arrange for makeup testing. For unplanned absences due to illness, students should contact their teachers as early as possible to schedule a makeup exam. This ensures they stay on track and avoid falling behind.
- In the event that a student receives a low grade on a major assignment or exam, teachers will reach out via email to express their concern. We ask that you partner with the teacher and your student to find the best way to address the issue and provide any necessary support.
