To the families of the Class of 2028,

• Interim Comments and Grades

o Interim grades will be released to students and families next week. These grades provide a snapshot of each student's work and engagement in the course so far, offering insight into their current performance and identifying areas for improvement. Interim grades do not appear on transcripts and are not the students' final grades for the semester.

Policy regarding the A+

As mentioned at the start of the year, beginning with the Class of 2028, an
"A+" will no longer be awarded on interim or semester reports. This change
was made to prevent the A+ from impacting students' college applications by
implying a higher grade was possible. Going forward, an "A" will represent the
highest grade achievable.

• Family/Teacher Conferences

• Conferences will be held on December 5th and 6th in the Gym, and families will sign up for a time window rather than individual meeting slots. Each conference will last about 10 minutes, and there is no remote option. If you are unable to attend, prioritize the teachers you wish to connect with and reach out to them the following week to schedule a phone meeting about your student's progress. More details will be shared next week by the US Principal.

• Projects and Assessments Week (PAW)

Instead of the traditional "midterm" and "final" exam weeks in January and June, D-E has established the week before Spring Break as Projects and Assessments Week (PAW). During PAW, students will meet with their teachers and classmates in their regular classrooms for about 2 hours each day to work on a large-scale project or assignment that will contribute to their semester two grade.

• Student-Faculty Hearing Council

o In the case of significant or repeated disciplinary offenses, students may be required to attend a Student-Faculty Hearing Council, where a small group of elected faculty members and students will deliberate on the best course of action for the student's learning. More information about this process can be found on page 21 of the handbook under "Disciplinary Procedures."

• Systems of Support

 As students adjust to the increasing workload, please know that our learning specialists and psychologists are excellent resources to support their academic journey.
