After the site visits, both groups will come together at Ross Dock Picnic Area for lunch, provided by the D-E kitchen, and a chance to relax and enjoy some outdoor time as a class. We'll remain at the park until around 1:30 PM, after which students will return to campus for a special treat: an ice cream and donut truck, generously sponsored by the 9th Grade Parents' Association Representatives (huge thank you!).
